## Enrichment Program Details for 2023-2024

**Welcome back to school! I'm so excited to begin the school year with your students!**

- Gifted services will continue to be carried out through the classroom, you will receive 2 semester reports each year (in January and May) detailing how your child's education has been differentiated in the classroom.
- Additionally, the Student Enrichment Specialist is offering pull-out services for 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th grades during the school day beginning in September.
- After-school enrichment activities will also be available twice a month beginning in September for 5th, 6th, 7th AND (new this year) 8th, and 9th grades. You will receive more information on that from the Enrichment Coordinators in each building. In eighth grade, students may also apply to Roanoke Valley Governor's School (we have two spaces for upcoming 9th graders each year). Applications processes begin in December.
- In grades 10-12, classes are differentiated with offerings for Dual Enrollment and higher level math options. Students can also apply for Summer Residential Governor's School and Southwest Virginia Governor's School (year-round). Applications processes begin in December.

### **Does your child's schedule match his/her goals?**

- If your child is an 8th grader planning to apply for one of the two spots we have available at Roanoke Valley Governor's School (RVGS) for upcoming ninth graders, he/she must be enrolled in Algebra I during their eighth grade year. They must maintain an "A" to be considered for RVGS. Students may be enrolled in Geometry second semester (or summer before their ninth grade year) if accepted into RVGS.
- Current 10th and 11th graders planning to apply to Southwest Virginia Governor's School (SVGS) will need to complete Algebra II by the end of the current school year in excellent standing in order to be considered for SVGS their 11th and 12th grade years. High grades, SOL scores in the advanced range, excellent recommendations, and attendance are among things considered.
