Ways to practice your sight words:

- ❑ Fill a cookie sheet with rice, flour, or sand and write the words in it with your finger.
- ❑ Use sidewalk chalk and write them outside.
- ❑ Write your words in the bathtub
- ❑ Build letters with legos and put together to make a word
- ❑ Use a flashlight and a dark room. “Write” the words on the ceiling with the flashlight.
- ❑ Make your words out of playdoh
- ❑ Play Memory. Make two sets of word cards, flip over two cards and try to make a match.
- ❑ Use a stick to write the words in the dirt or mud.
- ❑ Build words with refrigerator letter magnets.
- ❑ Write words in shaving cream.
- ❑ Paint words with watercolors or other types of paint.
- ❑ Go on a sight word hunt. Look in poems, nursery rhymes, books, magazines, cereal boxes, etc.
- ❑ Play tic-tac-toe with two sight words, instead of using “x” and “o”.
- ❑ Practice a sight word each day using Jack Hartman and Jan Richardson sight word YouTube videos.
