Math Choice Board

Week of May 4-8

<p>Sorting</p> <p>Sort a pile of clean clothes and then help fold them 😊</p>	<p>Skip Counting</p> <p>Do the following exercises but instead of counting by 1s, count by 2s, 5s, and 10s. (Jumping jacks, windmills, arm circles, sit-ups, run in place, lunges, etc.)</p>	<p>Fidget Spinner Challenge</p> <p>Use the accompanying worksheet to count how many times you can do each task before your fidget spinner stops spinning!</p>
<p>Money</p> <p>Use cupcake liners and a muffin tin to practice counting money. Write a money amount on the bottom of each cupcake liner and place in a spot on the muffin tin and have your child fill up each with the right amount of change!</p>	<p>Comparing Numbers</p> <p>Go around the house and count two sets of items to compare. For example, count your racecars and action figures. Or count your baby dolls and Barbie dolls. Which item do you have more of?</p> <p>Racecars or action figures?</p> <p>Baby dolls or Barbie dolls?</p>	<p>Make 10</p> <p>Lay out 20 cards on the table (leave out face cards or change them to equal 0, while aces equal 1). Players take turns removing two cards that add up to 10, ultimately trying to remove all the cards from the table. It's harder than you think!</p>
<p>Time</p> <p>See how long it takes you to do each of the tasks below if you can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Clean up your toys- Make your bed- Run around the house 3 times- Ride your bike up and down an approved path- Do 20 jumps on the trampoline- Make 7 basketball shots in the goal- Do 5 cartwheels	<p>Measurement</p> <p>Line up your stuffed animals from shortest to tallest.</p> <p>Line up containers in the kitchen as to which one will hold the least to the most. (Parental guidance is needed.)</p> <p>Line up toys that weigh the most to the least!</p>	<p>Addition / Subtraction</p> <p>Play War with a deck of cards! Remove all of the face cards and split the deck into an equal amount for each player. Each player turns over two cards from their pile at the same time, find the sum by adding the two numbers together, and whoever has the biggest sum gets all cards from that round. Whoever has the most cards at the end of the game wins!</p> <p>Challenge: Find the difference by subtracting the two numbers; flip over three or four cards at a time; change the value of the face cards to bigger numbers like 11, 12, and 13!</p>

Alpha Boxes

Can you find a word for each letter of the alphabet that has to do with *summer*? Use the Alpha Boxes graphic organizer to track the words you find.

Action, Action, We Want Action!

Play Charades with your family. Ask everyone to write down 3-4 verbs (actions) on slips of paper. Mix them up, draw one out and ACT.

Music

Use pots/pans and wooden spoons to “make music” and create your own song. Other ideas for “music shakers” include putting buttons, seeds, or small blocks in Tupperware containers.

Word of the Day Challenge

As you read together, pick a word from the text that can be your family’s Word of the Day for the next day. Write the word on a card with a brief definition that you both create and have your child illustrate.

Which birds did you see the least of?</p>	<p>Addition/Subtraction</p> <p>Have a family member call out addition and subtraction problems and write the answer on a glass window/door using an expo marker</p> <p>Test a small part and make sure it comes off! 😊</p>	<p>Measurement</p> <p>Make a ramp for your racecars! Measure the distance your racecar travels using a ruler, tape measure, or nonstandard items like pennies, paper clips, straws, etc.</p> <p>Challenge: Use different kinds of toy cars/trucks and explore which ones travel the farthest and think about why!</p>
<p>Money and Addition</p> <p>Plan a take-out meal for your family at a restaurant and research how much money you will need for your meal! (Some restaurants have their menus online!)</p> <p>(Round up for dollar amounts because they don't need to need to add dollars and cents!)</p>	<p>Time</p> <p>Draw what you are doing at five different times during the day. We have learned time to the hour and half hour and had just started learning time to the five minutes before school closed!</p> <p>(Use worksheet with 6 boxes.)</p>	<p>Patterns</p> <p>Go outside and make three piles of objects (sticks, bugs, leaves, rocks, balls, etc.) Use these objects to create a pattern. You can create ABC, ABBC, AABC, or any other repeating pattern. Say your pattern using the object's names as well as with letters. Example: "rock, stick, leaf, rock, stick, leaf" and "ABC, ABC."</p>
<p>Fact Family Card Game</p> <p>Remove face cards except for aces which could be 1 and jacks could be 0! Deal a face down stack of 21 cards. Turn over 4 cards at a time. Look for a fact family (3, 4, and 7 because $3+4=7$, $7-4=3$). If you don't find one, continue to draw one more card until you do. Once you find a fact family, turn over more cards to have just 4 cards showing again. The object is to have as few cards left over when you get "stuck" as possible.</p>	<p>Math Worksheets</p> <p>Complete the math worksheets attached.</p>	<p>Seesaw</p> <p>Complete several math activities posted on Seesaw!</p>



Sight Word Knock Down



Number War

Place a deck of playing cards or Uno cards in the middle face down. Each player will draw three cards and add together to get the sum. Whoever has the biggest sum gets all cards. Play continues until all cards from the middle deck is gone. Whoever has the most cards at the end is the winner.

Measurement

Plant some grass in a plastic cup or a juice carton from the school lunches and measure how tall the grass gets this week! Keep a record each day and then give it a haircut! 😊



Word Problems

Create and solve story problems using your toys as characters!

Example: Elsa made 15 cupcakes but Sven ate 8 of them. How many does Elsa have left?

Example: Spiderman bought 6 cars. The Hulk bought 4. Batman bought 9 cars. How many cars did they buy altogether?

Number Sense

Pick any number that you want and write down as many ways to represent that number as you can!

Examples: word form, tally marks, pictures, addition/subtraction number sentences, base 10 blocks, etc.

Basketball

Play "Horse"! This is a game of basketball where the first player shoots. If he/she makes the basket, the second player must attempt the same shot. If the second player misses the shot, he/she receives the letter "h". If the first player misses, the second player is now the leader and can shoot from anywhere. Continue this pattern for the duration of the game until someone receives all letters to spell out "horse".

(Instead of horse, spell other sight words!)

Cloud Art

Go outside and observe the clouds. Do the clouds look like anything? A bunny? A dragon? A car?

Draw what you see!



Snowball Fight

Write one sight word really big per piece of paper. (This can be scrap paper!) Crumple each piece of paper into balls and have a snowball fight. After a few minutes, signal for players to stop and pick up the paper to read the sight words! Repeat as many times as you like 😊
