Describe the geographic region in which we live. Make sure to include facts about the land and water in this region.

Think of a creative way to remember Virginia's four major rivers AND their order!

(example: the James River is the southern most river)

If a person came across the *Fall Line*, what might he or she see? Draw a picture!

Name the five states that border Virginia. Think of a creative way to remember these states!

Since the *Coastal Plain* region is west of the Chesapeake Bay, make some predictions of what food sources may be available. Make a list!

Pretend you are taking a trip to visit a friend in the *Appalachian Plateau* region. What regions will you have to pass to get there? Draw a map to show your trip!
